Letter from Donald A. Lachman President of the Board of Directors

Dear Brigadoon Service Dog Supporters,

It is an honor to serve on the Board of Directors for Brigadoon Service Dogs and in a leadership position as Board President. I have had the privilege of working with Denise and Brigadoon for over 10 years as Special Projects Coordinator for the Washington State Department of Veteran Affairs (WDVA) and its close partner, the WestCare Foundation. It is while working with justice involved veterans that I became aware of the life altering impact of Brigadoon Service Dogs. Since starting my relationship with Denise and Brigadoon Service Dogs, I have personally observed the transformational impact Brigadoon dogs have on hundreds of disabled veterans, their families, and inmates at the state prisons.

As a Vietnam veteran, I proudly served in the Army Medical Service Corp first on an orthopedic surgery team and then in leadership of an air medical unit. Since 2005, I have been blessed to have one of the most rewarding positions in the State of Washington working to inspire leadership at the WDVA and WestCare Foundation as Special Projects Coordinator. In 2018, I retired from public service to accept a similar position at the WestCare Foundation continuing to work for John Lee, the former director of the state agency and now Deputy CCO for the WestCare Foundation.

My priorities as President of the Board include: 1) Implement the valuable succession planning conducted by the board in 2018. 2) Develop and implement a financial strategy that contributes to short and long-term financial goals. 3) Support board members in specific organizational activities. 4) Advance training efficiencies. 5) Contribute to the mission of Brigadoon Service Dogs organization.

Denise Publishes Training DVD!



Positive Reinforcement Puppy Training

Use this method and you can train your family pet to be as well behaved as a service dog. Denise, long-time service dog trainer, guides you step-by-step through the same training techniques she has used to train service dogs to help veterans and disabled people. There are two sections, foundations and basic training.

- 🐾 Foundations include: preparation, observing the dog, clicker training, name recognition, attention as behavior, kennel, and potty training.
- 🐾 Basic training includes: encouraging behavior, lure and sit, waiting at doors, collar cues, loose leash walking, recall, down & on the mat.

Throughout, Denise explains each step, demonstrates with puppies of varying ages and temperaments, and provides numerous tips and examples.

The Brigadoon Difference: By Ken Garrison

Ken is one of Brigadoon's inmate trainers at Coyote Ridge

I remember the exact moment. Fortunately I was alone with Oscar in the training room. I still glanced around to make sure nobody else had noticed.

I had been locked up for nearly five years at that time. Having trailed Shelter Rescue dogs nearly that entire time, I knew better than to allow myself to become attached. I loved the dogs and the sense of purpose that training them gave me. My "Dog Journal" listed 84 dogs trained. I was a calm, cool professional.

Brigadoon Service Dogs was a new challenge, and an opportunity to build my skills. As a veteran, it would give me the chance to train dogs who would provide life changing help to veterans and their families.

Oscar was an intelligent enthusiastic, energetic year old Red Fox Lab. We ran through some basic cues. Sit, Down, Stay, Recall, and Loose Leash Waking. All good solid work, but nothing new. I had trained dozens of dogs to do all the same things.

Then I tried "Brace." Brace is intended for people with stability issues. The dog stands a Heel or Side while the handler places their hand on the dog's shoulder to literally brace themselves.

Something about the way Oscar braced himself; instinctively widening his stance and staring straight ahead; something broke in my heart. I was completely overcome with emotion. I just sad down and hugged Oscar.

Since then Oscar and I have practiced "Brace" hundreds of times. In a couple of months he will go on to be with his new family, and spend the rest of his life serving others.

I will always remember Oscar. He helped me heal my heart. More importantly, he reminded me that I can still make a difference.

Here are some tips for keeping your dog cool this summer.


